## **GENERAL INTRODUCTION ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT**

> The Department of Psychiatry, Government Medical College Kathua started function in April 2019 and is in continuation of Psychiatry OPD which was already running at District Hospital Kathua. The department is running OPDs on all weekdays and has started indoor services for general psychiatric patients and de-addiction since January 2020 in addition to providing consultation liaison services. We have started exclusive de-addiction clinic on Mondays, Geriatric Psychiatry Clinic on Tuesdays, and Child Psychiatry Clinic on Wednesdays. The department of psychiatry has also initiated rural mental health services in collaboration with department of PSM, GMC, Kathua by starting weekly psychiatry OPD in RHTC, Budhi, Kathua and also planning to start weekly OPD in UHTC, Krishna Colony, Kathua in near future. The department has also the credit of starting the first Child psychiatry Clinic in Kathua district and De Addiction Centre. During the year 2020, the department provided out-patient consultation services to a total of 6875.
